Measure A - Santa Barbara County Transportation Infrastructure Sales Tax Renewal - SUPPORT

Measure A is critical for the maintenance of local
roads, public transportation funding, alternative
transportation programs including commuter
rail and bike paths, and continued widening of
US101.

Measures H & I - Santa Barbara School Bond Measure - SUPPORT

Measures H & I will provide monies for science,
art, music and technology programs. Measure
H (\$23/year for four years) is for the high school
district and Measure I (\$27/year for four years)
supports the elementary district.

Prop 7 – Solar and Clean Energy Act 2008 – OPPOSE

The Chamber opposes Prop 7 due to the
measure's potential to substantially drive up
energy prices in the state and its unworkable
mandates.

Prop 10 – Alternative Fuel & Renewable Energy – OPPOSE

Market forces are already driving sales of
alternative fuel vehicles. It does not make sense
for the State to go into debt in order to further
incentivize the purchase of such technology.

Prop 11 – The Voters First Initiative – SUPPORT

The Chamber has long believed that fair
redistricting is the key to meaningful political
reform. Prop 11 will allow the citizens, rather than
the Legislature, to create legislative districts that
will require elected officials to be accountable to
the voters.
